APRIL IS ACTIVE DOG MONTH

Like many owners, dogs are experiencing bigger waistlines. Maybe it is because of the cold and snowy winter? Maybe it is because we shared our comfort food? Whatever the reason, just like in humans, extra pounds on a dog can lead to health issues, including joint issues, respiratory issues, diabetes and even a shorter lifespan.

As we celebrate Active Dog Month, it is the perfect time to commit to better health for your canine best friend moving forward by adopting better habits for them:

- 1. Daily exercise like humans, dogs need at least 30 minutes of cardio. A brisk walk is great. Start slow and work up to a run by playing fetch or other games to have them work up a sweat.
- 2. Measure their meals. Make sure you are not overfeeding and avoid table scraps (as hard as it is to resist those eyes!).
- 3. Use veggies as a treat instead of higher calorie dog treats. Ice cubes can be fun treats, too.
- 4. Interactive toys giving your dog mental stimulation can be as effective as physical exercise on a cold or rainy day. There are many toys you can use to give your pup a workout, like using a treat ball to feed a meal of kibble.

WEST MILWAUKEE PARK HISTORY By Janet Omick

The Dickson family, have you ever heard of them? Maybe not, but you've probably been on what used to be their land and didn't know it. Part of their land is now West Milwaukee Park. It is 21.1 acres in size and located at 5000 W.

Burnham Street. The Dickson's donated the land to the Village of West Milwaukee and it was later turned over to Milwaukee County.

Andrew & Marcia Dickson owned 150 acres of farmland which is now partly occupied by Rexnord Corp. The Dickson home stood west of the present Village Hall, on 47th St. & Beloit Rd. Andrew Dickson died in 1900 & Marcia Dickson in 1932.

Their 50 acre dairy farm covered much of the Southwest portion of the village. Their son, Edgar, constructed a malleable iron foundry on the property which later became the Chain Belt Co.

Their homes were located on Dickson Lane, which was located South of present day, Beloit Rd. & Greenfield Ave. One house belonged to Edward Richards, a Civil War Veteran who often fired a cannon east of his home at sunrise & sunset.

4739 W. Beloit Rd. located East of the Dickson farmhouse was built by Andrew Dickson for his son, Edgar, and was later occupied by E. J Meisenheimer, the second village president & his son, Gilles. Today, it's rented out as an apartment.

These houses are located on Dickson Lane, south of Beloit Road and Greenfield Avenue. A horse barn can be seen in the background. The house on the right belonged to Edward Richards, a Civil War veteran who regularly fired a cannon east of the Soldiers' Home main building at surfise and sunset.



The Meisenheimer home stands at 4739 West Beloit Road, east of the Dickson farmhouse. Built fo Andrew Dickson's son Edgar, the house was later occupied by E. J. kids swam & fished. Many events were held there such as, the West Milwaukee 4th of July celebration, PRIDE & Labor Day picnics & St. Florian's Mass in the Grass. It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth, or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

- 1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
- 2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges on the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both state and federal fair housing laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a federal administrative agency the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a federal court action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition, under the Civil Rights Act of 1866, which only applies to racial discrimination, a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (414-297-3214, Ext. 8300 or 8301), or the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (414-227-4384).

Learning That Works

Students Return to School for Phase 2 & 3: Distance Learning



On Monday, February 1, 2021, families who selected to send their children to school for two days per week were able to do so bringing the start of a return to school. "We have been planning for this since March of 2020," said Superintendent, Marty Lexmond. "It's been a lot of collaboration, problem-solving, and making sure things were in place. We are very thankful to our families and staff for their flexibility, cooperation, and positivity."

"It's been a bit emotional too," adds Director of Leadership and Learning, Deidre Roemer. "We missed our students and we know they missed each other. We got lots of feedback from our teachers about happy homecomings and special moments."

Over the past several months, a safety plan to limit the spread of COVID-19 has been put in place. Like every district, plexiglass, sanitizer, masks, school isolation rooms, contact tracing and numerous safety considerations have been put in place. A health metric dashboard is used to monitor the data related to COVID.

"While the spread hasn't been linked to schools as much as we thought, it does continue to spread from social gatherings such as family parties and events. We must remain vigilant -- practicing social distancing, wearing face masks and still singing that old 'Birthday Song' when washing our hands," said Lexmond. "No plan that returns students and employees to schools can fully eliminate potential exposure to COVID-19 but we have been doing our very best to get to this moment and it feels good to see kids in classrooms again."

4-Year-Old Kindergarten Resident Enrollment Begins March 1, 2021 for the 2021-2022 School Year

Beginning March 1, 2021, resident families with children who will be four-years-old on or before September 1, 2021 are encouraged to enroll in 4-Year-Old Kindergarten (4K).

According to Director of Leadership and Learning, Deidre Roemer, "4K is the place where children start their education journey. Our primary focus is on the social and emotional growth of each learner and our curricular areas include development in language arts, mathematics, fine motor skills, large motor skills and work habits. Each area will be addressed through daily learning experiences which integrate science, social studies, art, music and health activities."





Enrollment forms are available online at www.wawm.k12.wi.us (Click on the Enroll button.) The Enrolment Center is located at the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District Administration Office at 1205 S. 70th Street - 5th Floor in West Allis. Business hours are Monday through Friday: 7:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. From September through May, the Enrollment Center is closed when school is not in session. From June through August, the Enrollment Center is closed on holidays and during the week of July 4th.

"We provide developmentally appropriate activities which address the individual needs and differences of each learner. We want to engage each child in meaningful experiences that promote a love of learning," adds Roemer. "It's an exciting time and so much fun!"



















- 2. By mail (complete the voter registration form): <u>elections.wi.gov</u>
 - Mail with proof of residency to: Village Clerk, 4755 West Beloit Road, West Milwaukee, WI 53214
- 3. In-person at your Municipal Clerk's Office: is restricted to the 2 weeks before an Election and ends at the close of business the Friday before an Election.
- 4. In-person at your assigned polling location on Election Day 7am-8pm Note: All options require acceptable proof of residency.

At <u>myvote.wi.gov</u> you can register to vote (new voter, name change and address changes), check your voter registration status, find your polling place, see your sample ballot, request an absentee ballot (military and permanent overseas voters only), and check provisional ballot status.



Following submittal to the Clerk's office of a completed Application for an Absentee Ballot, registered voters can receive a ballot in the mail or can vote in person at the Village Clerk's office. (Absentee voting in the Village Clerk's office is restricted to the 2 weeks before an Election and ends at the close of business the Friday before an Election.)
