Real Estate and Personal **Property Tax Payments**

Each year, the tax bills are mailed out in December. To have your 2019 taxes marked paid in 2019, they must be received in our office on or before December 30, 2019. Make sure you are aware of the holidays that we are closed for business, so as to alleviate any problems when paying your taxes.

Note: Please write your parcel number on the memo part of your check stub. Make sure your check is made out to the Village of West Milwaukee. If it is made out to another municipality, you will have to return it and have a new check made out to replace it. If the check is made out to you, the homeowner, and the Village, you must sign the back of the check.

TAX REFUNDS

The Village will not issue immediate refunds for overpayments of tax bills in excess of \$100.00. Refund checks will be issued with the next accounts payable run. There is a minimum fifteen (15) day waiting period for a refund check over \$100.00 to ensure your escrow check clears the bank. Should you wish to have a refund in a more expedient manner, you may request that your financial institute issue one check for the actual amount due for taxes and another

check to you for the remaining balance. Immediate refunds of amounts less than \$100.00 will only be given if the funds are available. Any refunds under \$10.00 will have to be picked up in-person.

PERSONAL PROPERTY TAXES

The Village must be notified of any and all changes to businesses. We must be notified if a business moves out so we can change the name and address of the property that needs to receive the PP bills and the statement of personal property form. In January, the assessor will send out the statement of personal property form for each business to report their amount of PP. This must be completed and returned to the assessor's office by March 1st of each year. If this is not reported and we are not notified of any changes, the assessor will figure the taxes accordingly based on the prior year's taxes and you will continue to receive PP tax bills.

> 1. Register to vote or make updates to your registration online at MyVote.Wi.Gov.

MyVote.Wi.Gov is easy to use. Online registration requires your Wisconsin driver's license or state ID number. If you have not updated your address yet with the Department of Motor Vehicles

(DMV) you can complete the update online during the registration process. Online registration ends three weeks before Election Day. You may still register in person in the Clerk's office during absentee voting or at your polling place on Election Day.

2. Vote on election day!

Bring your Wisconsin driver's license or state ID with you to meet the voting photo ID requirement. The address on your ID or license does not need to be current.

Additional Information:

- If you do not have a Wisconsin driver's license or state ID, you can get one for free at any DMV location. Please call (844) 588-1069.
- For information about registering to vote by mail or on Election Day, call (414) 645-1530 ext. 0.
- Other forms of photo ID can be used to meet the photo ID requirement. For a full list, visit BringItWisconsin.com.

What are the qualifications to register to vote?

- U.S. citizen
- 18 years of age or older on Election Day
- A resident of Wisconsin and have lived at your current address at least 10 days prior to the next election
- Not currently serving a sentence, including probation, parole, or extended supervision for a felony conviction Note: Misdemeanor convictions do not affect voting rights!
- Not otherwise disqualified from voting

When should I register or update my voter registration?

You will need to register to vote or update your voter registration if you:

- Have not previously registered to vote in Wisconsin
- Have had <u>any</u> change to your address since last voting
- Have had a name change since last voting
- Have not voted in over four years

To check or confirm your voter registration status, visit MyVote.Wi.Gov.

Where and when can I register to vote? Until 20 days before each election:

- By mail
- Online at MyVote.Wi.Gov

Until Friday at 5:00 p.m. before an election:

In-person at Village Hall (4755 W. Beloit Rd.)

On Election Day:

At your polling place (West Milwaukee Community Centre', 1345 S. 47th St.)

What documents do I need to register to vote?

Online registration: If you have a Wisconsin driver's license or Wisconsin state ID, no other documentation is necessary. If the address on your license or ID is not current, you may update it on the DMV website when completing the voter registration process. Go to MyVote.Wi.Gov for instructions. All other registration methods: If you are registering by mail or in-person, you are required to provide a proof of residence document that includes your name and current address. Examples of this document include a driver's license or state ID, a cell phone or utility bill, or bank statement or paycheck. A full list of accepted documents is available at www.WestMilwaukee.org.

How do I vote by Absentee Ballot?

Absentee voting is casting your vote prior to Election Day, either through the mail or in-person at the Clerk's office. Any registered voter can vote absentee in Wisconsin — no reason is necessary.

To absentee vote by mail: Request to vote through the mail by going to MyVote.Wi.Gov or call (414) 645-1530 to be mailed an application.

To absentee vote in-person: Visit the Clerk's Office (4755 W. Beloit Rd.).

Do I need a photo ID? Yes. Unless you are voting through the mail and certify that you are indefinitely confined or are a military or permanent overseas voter, you must present an ID. Will my ballot be counted? Yes. All absentee ballots are processed on Election Day at the polls if received by 8:00

Fall Hazard for Dogs, Cats, and Predatory Mammals and Birds: Rodenticide

When the weather starts to get chilly mice and other rodents will seek a nice warm place to spend the winter. That usually means in and around our homes.

Naturally, humans are not as excited to share their homes with these destructive freeloaders and will put out poisons to control the population. Thousands of unintended rodenticide victims succumb to these poisons every year, so we want to urge caution when using these products and remove deceased rodents from your property as soon as possible.

In order to attract rodents to these poisons they are manufactured to smell good and be tasty.

Unfortunately, that means they are also tasty to pets and a dog can ingest an entire bait in seconds. It will

take days for symptoms to appear and by then it could be too late. Make sure that your pets cannot get anywhere near rodent bait traps and check them often.

Leaving dead rodents outside or throwing them into wooded areas puts cats, dogs, coyotes, fox, hawks, eagles and other predators at risk for ingesting these remains and succumbing to the poison in their meal's digestive system. Please dispose of deceased small animals sealed in a bag in your sealed trashcan.

Live trapping is a humane option for both indoor and outdoor rodent control. Releasing trapped rodents far from residential properties is the best option to prevent them from another attempt at becoming an unwanted houseguest.

It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth. or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

- Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, 1. marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
- To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges of the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both state and federal fair housing laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a federal administrative agency the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a federal court action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition, under the Civil Rights Act of 1866, which only applies to racial discrimination, a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (414-297-3214, Ext. 8300 or 8301), or the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (414-227-4384).
