WHO IS WATCHING FLUFFY?

Having pets can present owners with anxiety when it is time to travel. Who can you trust to watch your pets? What are the costs?

With warmer weather approaching, it is best not to wait until the last minute to find the right person or place to bring your dog. The best sitters book up far in advance. Start searching now. Here are tips to ensure success when leaving your pet while you travel:

1. Make sure your pet is up to date on vaccines, is licensed, groomed if necessary and have copies of all their paperwork taken on your phone or printed and kept in safe place.
2. Have current photos of your pet in the event they go missing.
3. Have your pet microchipped and use your cell phone number for a contact number.
4. Plan with your vet to have your pet treated in an emergency and give them the name of the person who is sitting for you.
5. Get references and speak with the clients directly to ask questions. Take tours of facilities that offer boarding to ensure you see in person the place your pet will be staying in.
6. If your pet has medication or special food, make sure you provide enough to use during your trip and detailed instructions on how to administer or feed.

Finding the best care for your pet while you are gone is worth every penny in peace of mind.

WEST ALLIS HEALTH DEPARTMENT By Haley Kolbeck and Lilia Garcia

Did you know? The West Allis Health Department serves West Allis AND West Milwaukee residents. The health department clinic offers TB skin tests, immunizations for adults and children (based on eligibility) as well as blood pressure screenings. Not sure how to install your car seat correctly? Schedule a car seat installation check to ensure your child's car seat is installed safely and correctly. Birth and death certificates are available to eligible individuals. *Please note many of these services require an appointment.*

The environmental health team inspects and licenses many local establishments and businesses. They also provide support for concerns such as pests or rodents, rabies control, and lead poisoning prevention.

The WIC program provides a healthy food package monthly, nutrition education, breastfeeding education and support/referrals to other health and social programs. Services are available to women who are pregnant, breastfeeding or have had a baby in the past six months and children up to age five. Please call 414-302-8642 to schedule an appointment. Currently appointments are being done remotely by phone.

The West Allis Senior Center welcomes anyone 55 years and older for games, crafts, and other supportive programs for a small yearly membership fee. To inquire about memberships or join in on the fun call the Senior Center at 414-302-870.

Programe una cita de revisión para asegurar que el asiento de seguridad para niños este instalado seguro y correctamente. Actas de nacimiento y certificados de defunción están disponibles para personas elegibles. Por favor tome en cuenta que muchos de estos servicios requieren una cita.

El equipo de salud ambiental inspecciona y otorga licencias a muchos

establecimientos y negocios locales. También brindan apoyo para problemas como plagas o roedores, control de la rabia y prevención del envenenamiento por plomo.

El programa WIC proporciona un paquete de alimentos saludables mensualmente, educación nutricional, educación sobre lactancia materna y apoyo/referencias a otros programas sociales y de salud. Los servicios están disponibles a mujeres embarazadas, mujeres que están amamantando o que haya tenido un bebe en los últimos 6 meses y a niños hasta los 5 años. Por favor de llamar al 414-302-8642 para programar una cita. Actualmente las citas se están haciendo de forma remota por teléfono.

WEST MILWAUKEE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

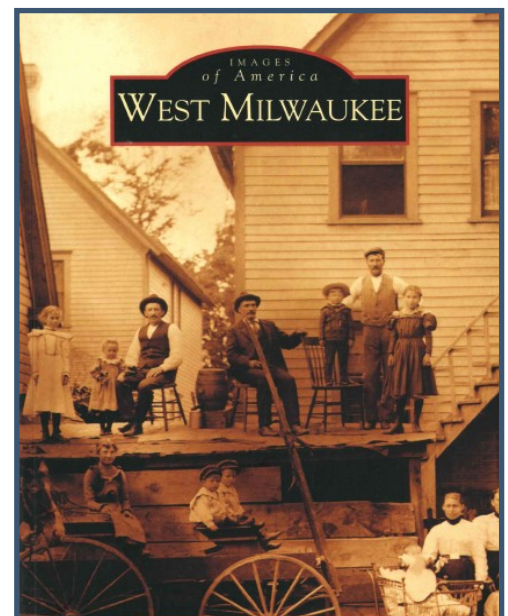

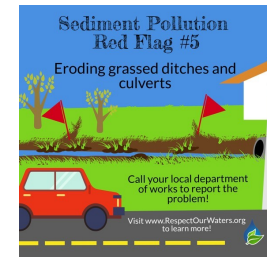
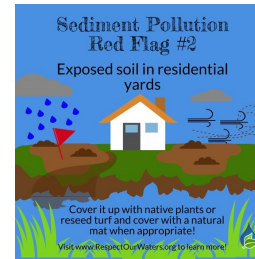

NEIGHBORS IN ACTION

It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth, or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges on the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both State and Federal Fair Housing Laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a Federal Administrative Agency, the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a Federal Court Action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition, under the Civil Rights Act of 1866, which only applies to racial discrimination, a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (414-297-3214, Ext. 8300 or 8301), or the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (414-227-4384).

ELECTION INSPECTORS (POLL WORKERS)

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Election Inspectors are essential to conduct open, accurate and fair elections. Their priority is to ensure every eligible voter can exercise their right to vote by following Election Day procedures and providing excellent customer service to voters.

The Village of West Milwaukee is in need of bilingual (fluent in English/Spanish speaking) poll workers.

QUALIFICATIONS

Be a U.S. Citizen

Be 18 years old (except qualified high school student poll workers)

Be a resident of Milwaukee County

Never have been convicted of a felony and not otherwise disqualified from voting

Be able to read and write fluently in the English language

Not be a candidate for any office to be voted on at the polling place at that election.

PAY

Election Inspectors receive \$135 for working a full Election Day.

In order to receive payment, the appropriate paperwork must be completed.

*New Election Inspectors are pending Village Board approval.

PRINCIPLE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Check-in Registered Voters

Register Eligible Voters

Monitor Voting and Ballot Marking Equipment

Assist and Guide Voters

Assist Chief Inspector as needed

EXPERIENCE SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Skills - Must possess excellent customer service skills. Strong clerical and analytical skills. Detail oriented. Active listener. Must possess good oral communication skills.

Abilities - Must be able to sit and/or stand for long periods of time.

TRAINING REQUIREMENT

Election inspectors are required to attend a 2-3 hour training class every two years.

INSPECTORES ELECTORALES (TRABAJADORES ELECTORALES)

Learning That Works

Referendum Would Lead to Cost Savings, Greater Opportunities for West Allis-West Milwaukee Students

On Tuesday, April 5, residents of the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District will vote on a referendum question. An approved referendum would allow the district to move ahead with projects to address our space and facility challenges.

The proposed projects include closing both high schools and reusing the Nathan Hale High School building to create a new, merged, comprehensive and modern high school. It would also involve creating more efficiencies by reducing positions and having less square footage to manage across our district.

If the referendum is approved, students in our district would all attend one high school. This would lead to cost savings of \$2.5 to \$3 million per year and a better overall high school experience for students.

By closing both existing high schools and repurposing and remodeling the current Nathan Hale building, we can provide students with the modern high school they deserve at a lower cost than building new. The remodeled school will also have a new name.

Additionally, the new high school will provide our students with modern learning spaces. We will be able to expand critical programs, including school-to-work pathways through expanded career and technical education areas.

The bottom line is that the proposed plan would align the district's enrollment with capacity by reducing the number of school buildings we operate and maintain. It would also amplify the educational, career and technical education, arts, athletics and co-curricular opportunities into a single, modern school.

An approved referendum would lead to a tax mill rate increase of \$1.19 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The owner of a home worth \$100,000 would see an increase of about \$119 per year. It's worth noting that the projected tax mill rate would still be less than what it was in 2020.

We have engaged our community members in our district's facility needs in various ways. Last year, our West Allis-West Milwaukee School District's Facilities Advisory Committee Team (FACT) began a six-month-long process to evaluate all district buildings and find consensus on a set of solutions, which were presented to the school board.



The board and district leadership look to continue this high level of community engagement right up to election day on April 5. We encourage you to visit the informational webpage, at wawmsd.org/discover/facility-planning, we have established to learn more about the district's facility needs, the community-driven process we have used to find a solution and the proposal on the ballot. **(continued on page 9)**

Personal Property Tax Payments

Your personal property taxes were due on January 31. If they were not paid in full, there is a 1.5% penalty and interest that accumulates per month, until paid in full.
