APRIL IS ACTIVE DOG MONTH By Karen Sparapani, MADACC

Like many owners, dogs are experiencing bigger waistlines. Maybe it is because of the cold and snowy winter? Maybe it

is because we shared our comfort food? Whatever the reason, just like in humans, extra pounds on a dog can lead to health issues, including joint issues, respiratory issues, diabetes and even a shorter lifespan.

As we celebrate Active Dog Month, it is the perfect time to commit to better health for your canine best friend moving forward by adopting better habits for them:

1. Daily exercise – like humans, dogs need at least 30 minutes of cardio. A brisk walk is great. Start slow and work up to a run by playing fetch or other games to have them work up a sweat.



- 2. Measure their meals. Make sure you are not overfeeding and avoid table scraps (as hard as it is to resist those eyes!).
- 3. Use veggies as a treat instead of higher calorie dog treats. Ice cubes can be fun treats, too.
- 4. Interactive toys giving your dog mental stimulation can be as effective as physical exercise on a cold or rainy day. There are many toys you can use to give your pup a workout, like using a treat ball to feed a meal of kibble.
- 5. Training your dog some new tricks or brushing up on old ones to get them moving.

Your dog counts on you to make the best decisions for them. These small changes can mean a longer life together.

Real Estate Tax Payments

<u>Your tax installments are due: 2nd installment is due April 30, 2023, Final Installment is due July 31, 2023.</u> Please make sure that your tax payment is either in our office by the due dates, or postmarked by the post office by this date.

Personal Property Tax Payments

Your personal property taxes were due on January 31, 2023. If they were not paid in full, there is a 1.5% penalty and interest that accumulates per month, until paid in full.

Learning That Works





The West Allis-West Milwaukee Board of Education completed its search for a new Superintendent on Tuesday, February 7, 2023. We are pleased to announce that Dr. Tarrynce Robinson has been selected as our district's next Superintendent effective on July 1, 2023.

Dr. Robinson shared the following statement with us:

"I am honored and excited to join the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District as your next Superintendent. I look forward to fostering a positive district culture, closing opportunity gaps for all students, and improving learning outcomes by "teaching the way our students learn". I want to thank the West Allis-West Milwaukee Board for their vote of confidence. I cannot wait to partner with teachers, parents, students, district personnel, and community members as we continue to move the district forward."

It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth. or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

- 1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
- 2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges on the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both State and Federal Fair Housing Laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a Federal Administrative Agency, the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a Federal Court Action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition, under the Civil Rights Act of 1866, which only applies to racial discrimination, a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (414-297-3214, Ext. 8300 or 8301), or the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (414-227-4384).

(b) No person shall make, continue or cause to be continued any loud, unnecessary or unusual noise or any noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers or tends to annoy, disturb, injure or endanger the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others within the limits of the village.

SCOOP THE POOP

Attention Pet Owners...Please help in keeping our community clean! Pet waste can carry diseases, bacteria and parasites that are harmful to people, other animals and our waterways.

Whether in your yard, in the park, or along our sidewalks always

pick up after your pet right away! Always carry plenty of waste bags with you and dispose of waste properly. Your environment and your neighbors will thank you!

Village Ordinance, Sec. 10.—Animals at large and animal litter nuisance.

(c.) Animal litter nuisance. No owner or caretaker of any animal may appear with the animal on any street, alley, sidewalk, lawn, field, or any public property or upon a property of another without a shovel, scoop, bag or other items for the removal of fecal matter. The owner or caretaker of an animal shall immediately remove all fecal matter by shovel, scoop, bag or other item after deposit of fecal matter on such premises and properly wrap and deposit the fecal matter in a tightly covered, waterproof waste container situated upon his or her own premises. The owner or person in charge of any private property shall not permit solid fecal matter of animals to accumulate on such property, including the space between the street or curb and the sidewalk adjacent to such property, for a period in excess of 24 hours.

(Absentee voting in the Village Clerk's office is restricted to the 2 weeks before an Election and ends at the close of business the Friday before an Election.)

ELECTRONIC POLL BOOKS

The Village of West Milwaukee will be implementing e-poll books during the 2023 Spring Election Primary on February 21, 2023.

WHAT ARE THEY?

- They will replace the paper poll books
- Voters will digitally sign the screen
- Are NOT connected to the internet
- You still receive a paper ballot after checking in on the e-poll books



WHAT DO THEY DO?

- Check in Voters
- 2. Register New Voters
- 3. Process Absentee Ballots

ARE THEY SAFE?

These electronic devices are **NOT** connected to the internet, and the security risk factors for the Badger Books are comparable to those using paper poll books. Badger Books do not process votes. After checking-in, you will receive your paper ballot to vote and feed into the tabulator.

AUTHORIZATION

Badger Books are not voting equipment, and the Wisconsin Elections Commission has authority to approve electronic poll books. Per Wis. Stat. § 6.79(1m), "the system employed to maintain the list electronically is subject to the approval of the Commission."

Also, per Wis. Stat. § 5.05(18), "the Commission may facilitate the creation and maintenance of electronic poll lists for purposes of s. 6.79 including entering into contracts with vendors and establishing programs for development and testing."

Village of West Milwaukee's Village Board approved the purchases in the 2022 budget cycle.
