WEST MILWAUKEE ASSESSMENT VALUE UPDATES 2024

The Village's statutory Assessor, Associated Appraisal Consultants, will be conducting a revaluation of all properties in 2024 for the purpose of updating all assessed values to reflect current market conditions.

Wisconsin laws require periodic revaluations to keep assessment levels at or very near actual market values. The basic objective of a revaluation is to achieve equity and uniformity in the assessments, so each property bears only its fair share of the property tax burden based on its market value. The last time the Village's assessments were updated to market value was in 2015. Since the last revaluation, the level and uniformity of assessments have gradually eroded, and a revaluation is required to remain in compliance with the law's requirements. Based on the assessor's latest estimates, the Village's assessment values are averaging approximately 30% below recent sale prices.

It is important to understand that no additional tax revenue will be generated or collected because of the revaluation. Following a revaluation, the property tax burden is redistributed based on all properties being assessed at current market values. This means you will not automatically pay more in property taxes purely due to a higher assessment. The differences in taxes paid by property owners are the result of assessments that changed more or less than the average increase Village-wide.

The assessed values of all taxable properties in the village will be updated to reflect current market conditions at 100% market value. Notices of changed assessment will be distributed when the property reviews are complete and new assessed values are determined for each property. Property owners will have an opportunity to discuss the assessed values with an Associated Appraisal representative during the Open Book process. After the Open Book process, any property owner who still disagrees with their new assessment value after speaking with an assessor will have the opportunity to appeal an assessment to the Board of Review. The notice of assessment will contain the dates and times of the Open Book and Board of Review meetings along with an insert containing helpful information about the revaluation.

It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth. or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

- 1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
- 2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges on the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both State and Federal Fair Housing Laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a Federal Administrative Agency, the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a Federal Court Action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition. under the Civil Rights Act of 1866. which only applies to racial discrimination. a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240), the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (414-297-3214, Ext. 8300 or 8301), or the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (414-227-4384).



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*** Free <u>SPECIAL PICK UP</u> is the 2nd Monday of each month. Please call the Public Works Department: 645-6238 to schedule. No items are to be set out for collection more than 24 hours in advance of schedule pick-up day. The Village will not accept tires, batteries, construction debris, electronic devices or house hold hazardous waste.

*** YARD WASTE will be picked up on the 1st and 3rd Monday of each month starting in April and continuing through November. Yard waste includes grass clippings, leaves, garden debris and brush/branches LESS than six (6) inches in diameter and a maximum length of four (4) feet. Yard waste can be put in the street October 15th—November 15th.

** YARD WASTE PLACED IN PLASTIC BAGS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP!!**

Grass clippings, leaves and garden debris <u>must</u> be put in paper compostable yard waste bags or up to a 32-gallon trash container that can be emptied into the collection truck. Residents who have alley garbage pick-up must have the yard waste by their garbage cans. Residents who have carry-out garbage must have the yard waste in front of their home between the curb and sidewalk. The Village encourages all home owners to leave grass clippings on their lawn.

PUFFY COATS & CAR SEATS

Puffy winter coats affect how the harness in a car seat fits your child. The extra coat padding makes it hard to get the harness to fit correctly. The harness might feel snug, but the extra material will compress in a crash, making the harness too loose. Loose harness straps mean your child will not be safe in a crash. ADOPT-A-HYDRANT PROGRAM

As the snow begins to fall, please help the Fire Department by adopting the fire hydrant closest to your home or business and keep it free of snow.

Please make it a point to uncover your fire hydrant after each and every snowfall. Clear a path approximately 3 feet around the hydrant and shovel a 3-foot path from the road to the fire hydrant. Should the need arise, these actions will allow the Fire Department to quickly locate the fire hydrant, obtain a water supply for firefighting activities, and give the Fire Department room to work around the hydrant.

Please consider helping a neighbor in need of assistance by shoveling out a hydrant in front of their home. This act of kindness will benefit the entire neighborhood that the hydrant services.

A fire engine/pumper carries enough water on board for approximately 2 to 3 minutes of firefighting. In the event of a fire, the Fire Department must quickly locate and gain a water supply from the closest fire hydrant. If a fire hydrant is buried by snow, valuable time must be spent locating the hydrant and digging it out. It may take from 4 to 6 minutes to dig out a fire hydrant buried by snow. The delay in gaining a water supply from a fire hydrant may disrupt the timely manner in which firefighters are able to fight the fire and way allow a fire to grow. Fire doubles in size approximately every 18 seconds.

The Adopt-A-Hydrant Program is an informal program; therefore, it is not necessary to advise the Fire Department which hydrants you will be clearing snow from.

SNOW REMOVAL

Do not blow snow onto the street, alley or other Village right-of-way at any time. Try to find off street parking whenever there is snow accumulation. Vehicles parked on both sides of the street make it very difficult for a plow to pass and service the street. Clear out adequate space for your garbage/recycling containers on your collection day. If you are concerned about snow removal at your property, you may wish to contact.

REAL ESTATE TAXES

Receiving a Tax Statement

Property tax statements are typically mailed by the second full week in December. The bills are mailed to the owner of record per the Milwaukee County Registrar of Deeds unless an official mailing address change has been made at the Village Clerk's office or Assessor's office prior to November 15. If you do not receive a tax bill by December 15, the tax bill can be obtained online.

To have your 2023 taxes marked paid in 2023, payments must be received in our office on or before December 28, 2023. Make sure you are aware of the holidays that we are closed for business, to alleviate any problems when paying your taxes.

You Can Use the Property Tax Portal to:

- Access your tax bill or balance
- Make a tax payment, includes user fees
- Obtain and print your tax bill
- Obtain and print your tax summary, which shows balance due and payments made
- See the receipt for your property tax payment

Due Dates

- Pay in full by January 31. (Real Estate and Personal Property Bills)
- Pay in three interest-free installments for Real Estate Bills by January 31, April 30, and July 31.

Preparing the Payment

- Include your tax bill.
- Make checks payable to the Village of West Milwaukee and write your tax parcel number in the memo area of your check.
- If you pay with an escrow check from your mortgage company, you need to endorse the check. If it is made out to another municipality, you will have to return it and have a replacement check made.

Pay by Mail

- Pay by mail using the return envelope that came in your tax
 bill
- Address your envelope to Village of West Milwaukee, 4755 W.
 Beloit Rd. West Milwaukee, WI 53214.
- For <u>payment due dates</u>, the receipt date for timely mailed payments will be the date on the U.S. Postal Service postmark.

TAX REFUNDS

There is a minimum fifteen (15) day waiting period for a refund check. Should you wish to have a refund in a more expedient manner, you may request that your financial institute issue one check for the actual amount due for taxes and another check to your for the remaining balance. Any refunds under \$5.00 will have to be picked up in person.

Personal Property Taxes

The Village must be notified of any and all changes to businesses. We must be notified if a business moves out so we can change the name and address of the property that needs to receive the personal property bills and the statement of personal property form.

In January, the assessor will send out the statement of personal property form for each business to report their amount of personal property. This must be completed and returned to the assessor's office by March 1st of each year. If this is not reported and we are not notified of any changes, the assessor will figure the taxes accordingly based on the prior year's taxes and you will continue to receive personal property tax bills.
