Pierre is great with children & cats, making him a wonderful addition to a family. However, for now, he'd thrive best as the only dog in the household. Meet Your New Best Friend!



WEST MILWAUKEE STRONG NEIGHBORHOODS PROGRAM

Upgrade Your Home's Exterior with Up to \$5,000 in Matching Grants!

The Strong Neighborhoods Program is a matching grant initiative, that aims to fund exterior upgrades to residential properties. Owner-occupied homes are eligible for a 1:1 match. For every dollar you invest in your home improvement, you can receive an equal amount in grant funds, up to a maximum of \$5,000. Non-owner-occupied homes are eligible for a 1:2 match, up to the same maximum of \$5,000.

The program covers a range of exterior improvement activities including but not limited to, siding and roofing repairs, exterior masonry repairs, window upgrades, exterior paint, and

front porch repairs. To qualify, no more than 30% of your household's gross monthly income can be spent on housingrelated expenses, which include your mortgage, property taxes, and home insurance. With a streamlined application process, you can get started on your improvements quickly and without hassle.

It is the policy of the Village of West Milwaukee to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth. or age, and to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within West Milwaukee for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.

2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges on the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the Village ordinance (50-30) or State Statute (106.50), may file a complaint after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred. In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both State and Federal Fair Housing Laws. If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a Federal Administrative Agency, the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a Federal Court Action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition. under the Civil Rights Act of 1866. which only applies to racial discrimination. a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint. Additional contact telephone numbers for complaints include the Metropolitan Milwaukee Fair Housing Council (414-278-1240).



During a car wash, harmful debris, motor fluids, and soap are washed off of vehicles. When untreated, these materials may runoff into storm drains and have the potential to cause harm to nearby aquatic environments. Whenever possible, opting for the commercial car wash over the at-home car wash reduces the amount of pollutants entering waterways. Many professional car washes collect their used water, treat it, and recycle it, greatly reducing the amount of freshwater they consume! If you decide to wash your car at home, washing it over the grass is a great way to prevent harmful runoff. If washed on paved surfaces such as driveways and roads, runoff collects pollutants and can flow into waterways. Therefore, washing cars over an unpaved surface such as your lawn and limiting the amount of water used helps to prevent water pollution.

As we step into the new year, we're excited to continue our mission of providing engaging, equitable, and accessible programs and services for our amazing community. Thank you for making 2024 so memorable — we can't wait to see what we'll achieve together in 2025!

Let's kick off this new year with an update on the Activity & Fitness Center from Shelly Strasser!

We are so excited to welcome you to the Activity & Fitness Center or AFC as we like to call it! This name is reflective of the physical programming that will occur here. We wanted to find a way to connect this location with the Recreation & Community Services Center on 68th Street while also giving it an identity of its own as it truly looks and feels different. Phase 1 of this project is complete and we have received occupancy, so currently we have Early Childhood classes, Spin Classes, Youth Basketball and Open Badminton. Starting in April, the Board of Education will meet here and additional programming will be added.

As for next steps, our Phase 2 design is almost complete and construction on Phase 2 will begin in March. This phase will include a Community Fitness Center, Personal and Small Group Training room, and a new welcome & reception front desk area. The WAWM School District recognizes the Recreation & Community Services Department role in providing programs to West Allis & West Milwaukee residents with programs that support social, emotional, cultural, physical, intellectual and economic well being. The consolidation of Lane Intermediate School provided an opportunity to preserve the property for the community and expand the department's program offerings and reach.
